SEAFORD TOWN FORUM – TUESDAY 29TH APRIL 2014

The Seaford Town Forum was held at Seaford Baptist Church on the 29th April 2014 where the local councillors were asked to come along so that the residents of Seaford could have their say and give their opinions on matters affecting Seaford town.
