STAFF CHANGES AT STC

A new member of staff joined the Council in August. Kevin Gordon, a retired British Transport Police officer will be known to many readers as he previously worked part-time in the Tourist Information Office at Seaford and writes a weekly history item for one of the local newspapers. Kevin will work as the secretary to the Mayor and will also undertake general admin duties.

LOCAL CHARITIES BENEFIT FROM REVENUE GRANTS

A total of £4,400 was provided by Seaford Town Council to local causes as part of the local revenue grant scheme. Grants between £50 and £500 were awarded to 32 local organisations including the Sussex Air Ambulance and the Seaford Lifeguards who ensure that Seaford people and visitors are kept safe when they visit Seaford.

Charities representing both younger and older residents were supported as well as musical charities such as the Seaford Silver Band and Seaford Music Society.

£100 grant was given to the Friends of Tide-Mills and their chairman, Jim Skinner thanked the council saying "This grant goes towards providing litter-pickers and refuse sacks so that our members can continue to provide a monthly beach-clean at this important part of our coast"

STAFFING STRUCTURE REVIEWED

Seaford Town Council has reviewed its staffing structure to reflect its current and future needs better. The posts of Administration Manager and Responsible Finance Officer will be replaced by a Corporate Services Manager who will be responsible for the finance & accounting and office management functions; whilst a Projects and Facilities Manager will look after the Council's land and assets and develop projects.

In the next financial year administration staff will work additional hours to assist in the development of services.

Councillor Jon Freeman, Leader of the Council said "Seaford Town Council has recently begun a Vision Planning process by prioritising the development needs of assets, the new staffing structure will ensure we have the staff in place to deliver our plans"
